#### MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR MARCH 2012

#### ... TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW...

The month of March was mostly characterized by dry and warm weather with high pressure affecting the southwestern states. Many dry and sunny days led to above normal high temperatures with clear and cool nights bringing below normal minimum temperatures. The majority of March's precipitation fell with one major Pacific storm system that affected the state from March 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>. This storm brought the only precipitation of the month for many locations, and thus overall monthly precipitation was extremely variable from location to location.

# March 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> Major Winter Storm: Strong Winds Followed by Heavy Snowfall

A very strong cold front approaching Arizona on Saturday, March 17<sup>th</sup> brought strong southwest winds to much of northern Arizona. Below is a list of peak wind reports.
